I'm sorry...I got caught up in fire stuff and forgot to send you this. I don't know if HLC is even meeting today because of the fire but here are my thoughts on making the Live Oak Dairy facade and our beloved cow land marks.

Dear Historic Landmarks Commission:

1. The facade of the old Live Oak Dairy at the corner of Milpas and Canon Perdido is one of the few Art Deco facades in Santa Barbara and is deserving of preservation for that reason alone.
2. The prominence of this unique facade to the Milpas street scape is of long-standing and marks this Santa Barbara corner as "ours."
3. The COW is crucial!!! Since the 1940s this iconic bovine has literally marked the territory for all Santa Barbara High School Dons. As a 25-year member of the Santa Barbara High School Alumni Association, a 1967 Don, and a native Santa Barbarian, I cannot overstate the importance of the cow and its pedestal to the collective history, gestalt, and consciousness of the Eastside corridor.

I have attached some images that you might also enjoy. (And remember, this tradition has been going on for at least 65-70 years!) Dons are noting if not tenacious!
